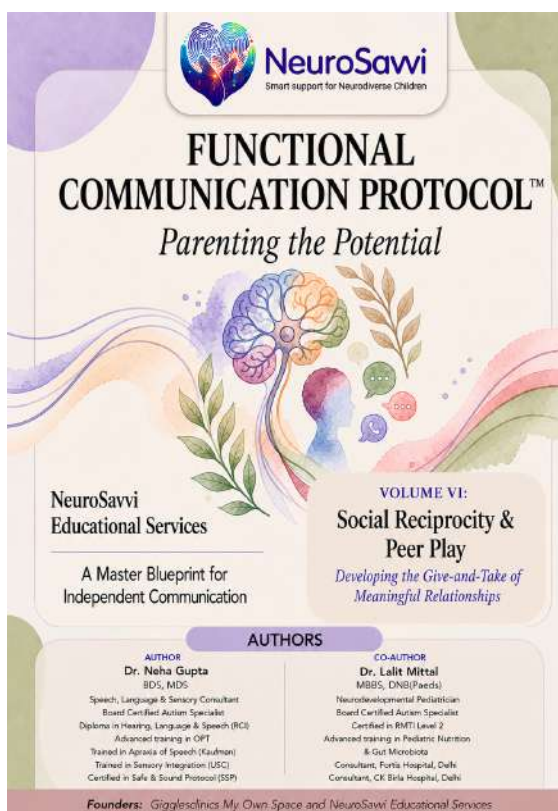

What This Volume Is About

Volume 6 focuses on the mechanics of real conversation and social exchange. The child learns that communication is not only about answering questions - it is also about initiating, taking turns, monitoring the listener and repairing misunderstandings.

The volume extends these skills into peer interaction, topic maintenance, time and location concepts, category vocabulary and logical “why” reasoning. The goal is more natural participation in friendships, play and group settings.



Every volume includes the same orientation tools, so parents can understand the full sequence and begin at the level that matches the child today - not the level they hope to reach later.

Who Should Read This Volume?

- Your child can tell stories, reason and answer WH questions.
- Conversation with adults is stronger than conversation with peers.
- Joining a group or maintaining a topic is difficult.
- Turn-taking becomes one-sided or breaks down quickly.
- The child wants friends but does not know how to begin or sustain interaction.
- Misunderstandings are not noticed or repaired independently.

4 What Problem This Volume Solves

- Moves the child from answering to actively participating in conversation.
- Teaches hidden conversational responsibilities such as checking the listener.
- Provides practical tools for repairing breakdowns rather than withdrawing.
- Builds language needed for peer play, group learning and friendship.

What You Learn From This Volume

- Use greetings, closings and appropriate initiations.
- Use time and location concepts in conversation.
- Maintain reciprocal turn-taking.
- Understand opposites and expand category vocabulary.
- Stay on topic and shift topics more smoothly.
- Answer logical “why” questions.
- Monitor whether the listener understands.
- Join peer activities with more confidence.
- Ask for clarification and repair communication breakdowns.
- Generalise conversational skills across people and settings.

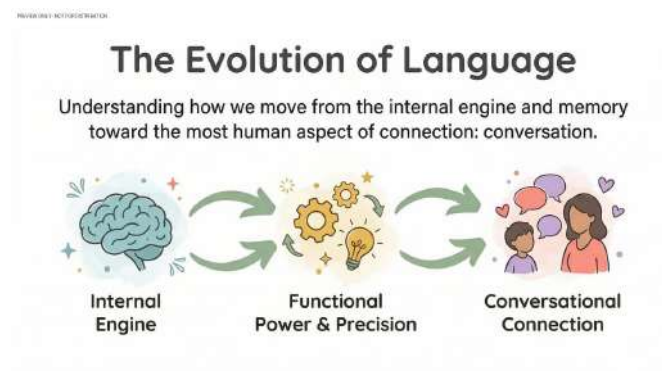
